





If you are looking for some spiritual inspiration, deep in the heart of Navsari rests a structure that pulses with sanctity and soulfulness. The Vadi Dar-e-Meher is the second oldest Dare-Meher in India, after the Iranshah. This is the sacred place where over 10,000 boys of the Bhagarsath and other Anjumans passed through their Navar and Maratab ceremonies. Only those children who passed through these hallowed portals had their names entered in the Great Register of the Bhagarsath Anjuman and only they were authorised to perform ceremonies within the jurisdiction of the Bhagarsath Anjuman.

On the day of their Salgreh, Parsi Times doned its mathabanna, bent its head in reverence and walked in.... P.T. Writer Khushroo P. Mehta files this report.

n special invitation from an ardent PARSI TIMES Reader and well wisher Mr. Fardoon Baian. I took a trip to Navsari to find out more about the Vadi Dar-E-Meher and attend the Salgreh.

It was on the early morning of the 20th December that I received a very warm welcome from Mr. Bajan who had especially come to pick me up from the station at the slightly unearthly hour of 5 a.m. A healthy Parsi breakfast at his residence followed. At 8 am. he took me on a tour around Navsari. We finished at the Aatash Behram where I went in and paid my deepest respects with prayer and tandorosti. I then headed on foot to the Vadi Dar-E-Meher.

Soon I was in front of a huge wall and an antique looking main entrance door of the Agiary. All by myself, I took slow steps into the building complex, every wall and every door narrated history. It was the kind of place every Zarthosti should explore at least once and feel the magic themselves. I saw the two holy wells, the traditional Navar Martab ceremony rooms, the religious rituals rooms and the special room where the Holy Aatash [Dadgah] was kept ablaze by the priest in attendance.

The Vadi Dar-E-Meher is the training centre for Mobeds of the region and they all take turns to come and serve the Holy Aatash at this place

Soon I could see the enthusiastic Ervads getting ready and moving towards the open hall where the Salgreh Jashan was slated to be held at 9.30 a.m. Mr. Bajan soon joined me. I was informed that the Vada Dasturji of Navsari Ervad Kaikhushroo Navroze Dastoor (more popularly known as K. N. Dastoor, or KND), whom the Bhagarsath Anjuman had elected as the 17th Dastur MeherjiRana (To follow Dastur Meherji Dastur Kekobad, who expired on 23rd January 2010); was especially here to attend the Salgreh Jashan and take part in the prayers. He had done his Navar ceremony from the Vadi Dar-E-Meher!

The Salgreh Nu Jashan prayers began around 9.30 a.m. and were performed by six Ervads around the Jashan Nu Aatash and 8 Ervads sitting on the benches around the Jashan area. A total of 14 Mobeds including the Vada Dasturii prayed for the small crowd that was deep in prayer.

As always the announcements in PARSI TIMES draw pilgrims and Bedins from far. On that particular day there were 5 visitors from Navroze Baug and Rustom Baug, Mumbai who after having read the notice had made plans to especially make it to Navsari and visit the historic Dar-E- Meher on this Salgreh

The lot was very impressed and moved by the unity and uniformity with which the 14 Ervads performed the Jashan. The Ervads, a happy lot of 14, posed for us. An exchange of gratitude and greetings followed. Mr. Bajan took me to the well, which had potable water and a drink of the holy water rejuvenated my mind and body to new levels of freshness.

After that I paid a visit to the Holy Varasyaji who is very aggressive toward any newcomer around him. He is young and has been here for the last five years. His Taro is used for the holy rituals in becoming a Navar and other Nirangdins.

Timeless Travel Memories

In a nutshell

As per the historic records available, it is understood that sometime after the Parsi settlement at Sanjan in Gujarat (936 AD), the laity began to spread out. Some moved a little north to the small port of Navsari. As their numbers grew in Navsari they requested their brethren in Sanjan for a Preist of their own to guide the local Community. Zarthost Mobed with his son Kamdin went there in

An old Community function here

1142 AD/511 YZ and the building of Vadi Dar-E-Meher was originally established in 551 YZ/1182 AD.

Over the years the structure has gone through many facelifts. It was repaired by the Anjuman, then re-built by Desai Mancherji Khurshedji, at his own expense and consecrated on 7th Feb 1795 (Hormazd Roz, Amardad Mahino 1164 YZ). More changes occurred when it was re-consecrated and oh the 27th Aug

1909 (Meher Roz, Aspandard Mahino, 1278 YZ). The old building was later renovated by Ervad Khurshedji Behramji Sahiar at a cost of Rs.25, 000/-in memory of Hama Asho Farohars on 21st Mar 1930 (Daepmeher Roz, Meher Mahino 1229 A.Y.).

Vadi Dar-E-Meher is also called the Bhagarsath Anjuman Dar-E-Meher. This place is mainly used for performing rituals and

for training and initiating Parsi priests, as Navars & Martabs

I rummaged through an old book pulled out and maintained well by the aging yet alert Ervad Hormuzji Bapuji Kotwal. Ervad Kotwal mentioned that J.N. Tata and even Jamshedji Nasserwanji Tata were students of this Vadi. Jamshedji Nasserwanji Tata completed his Navar here in 1845.

I made it a point to visit more of Navsari for our Readers.

The "First Dastur Meheriirana Library" and the house [birthplace] of Seth Jamshedji Nasserwanji Tata (The Grand Old Man of Indian Industry) were on my list. This house is soon to be converted into a historic museum and there was renovation work going on there. It was strange that I felt nostalgia while walking around considering this was my first trip to the historic town. Maybe it was my roots and ancestry pulling me in. Does everyone feel that way about Navsari? After my trip I suggest that even if you are in India for a short trip, one day in Navsari can make it richer in memories.

Today, while I write this article the equity market has already breached the lifetime high and may witness further rise even in the coming days. On a lighter note you would have made astronomical returns in Onions and Tomatoes, because they have appreciated by 278% and 122% in just 1 year. It's just not onions that bring us tears but their prices also do.

Gold has lost its sheen, real estate industry is stagnant, deposit rates are not even at par with inflation and ironically the retail investors are net sellers in the equity market. The biggest question that currently stares us in the face is WHERE TO INVEST? Let us understand various investment asset classes and the current risk associated with it.

GOLD

Who says Gold is a safe haven. Prices have dropped by 10% locally and internationally the value of this yellow metal has eroded by over 30%. The impact of erosion has not been drastic in India due the Rupee depreciation against the Dollar and we are net importers of

Gold. Gold prices can be as speculative and volatile as a stock market. I am of the firm belief that the price of anything cannot rise forever. For some

cannot rise forever. For some history-conscious investors, fear of a repeat of the gold price crash of 1980 may be

keeping them out of the gold market. Just for someone who is not aware, Gold had hit a record high in the beginning of 1980 because of high inflation and strong oil prices and then in August 1999 Gold hit an all time low eroding almost 70% of its value. i.e.

someone who had invested in 1980 and held it for almost 20 years he/she would have lost 70% of his money.

I guess anything that goes up too soon has to come down. The moment we witness a global recovery we can see Gold lose a bit of its glitter. I guess at these levels gold is in an unchartered territory and investors have to be extra cautious. Although there may be some more steam left in Gold but watch your step. At these levels invest via SIP (Systematic Investment Plan) through Gold ETF funds. Please remember that Gold is taxed.

REAL ESTATE

Undeniably it has been the best performing asset

class for the last many years but certainly the most unorganized sector with lack of transparency. The Real Estate Bill, 2013, seeks to set up a regulatory authority to protect consumers and promote the real estate sector. Currently

Realty is bleeding and its revival would take some time. The high cost of borrowing is squeezing developer's margin and also the expensive loan rates is affecting buyers. The current rental yield in Mumbai and Pune is around 3% and 4% p.a respectively i.e. if I buy a property now and put it on

rent the return is a miniscule 2%-3% per annum on the overall investment. Also with the upcoming elections, Babu's who stash away their so called hard earned (unaccounted) money in this sector may require them now for vote banks, this will result in slight liquidity crunch.

Please avoid dealing with under-constructed properties, deadlines may not be met and you may be stranded. Readymade construction is a better option. It is an asset class to be considered for long term because of its illiquid nature. We may witness further slowdown in this sector and investors are advised to be cautious. However, anyone with a decent bank balance is in a good bargaining position.

FIXED DEPOSIT/ TAX FREE BONDS/ NCD`S

Considering that interest rates are peaking it is prudent

to deploy funds into fixed income avenues like Fixed Deposits, Debt Mutual funds, Tax free bonds and Non-convertible debentures of secured companies. However, the stark reality is that such instruments do not beat inflation but the safety aspect is

essential to consider in ones investment portfolio. Hence I would certainly recommend these instruments in ones portfolio.

EQUITY

This is one asset class which is heading for a boom and anyone who invests here for long term will make money unless the product is a revenue making machine for a bank/ broking firm with high hidden costs. Although we may head for short term volatility but the long term trend is very good. Just a few months ago business channels functioned more like an astrology channel and predicted the doomsday of the market, what happened? As usual they were wrong. No one on earth can predict the market or time it. It is a futile effort to outsmart the market, it is like challenging Rajnikant. Valuations are still cheap now, in 2014 you should witness inflation being tamed, subsequently interest rate cycles reversing, cost of capital will eventually reduce and company margins will improve. Fiscal deficit is the fly in the ointment with high import bills but overtime it will be controlled. The US Fed announcement in December will decide the faith of easy flow of money which can bring short term jitters to the market. Right now the economy is in its worst shape and ironically the stock market is rising, this trend has stumped investors. Please note that the stock market does not wait for Santa claus to arrive so it could begin rallying, it moves when valuation becomes very cheap. The sad story is that retail investors have been net equity sellers while foreign institutions have been net buyers. Investing into stocks is not gambling as long as your investment is not based on speculation. Stock represents the ownership of a company. Investing into stocks is investing in a business opportunity which you should be able to foresee and understand. This is the best and most liquid asset class for very long term investors.

Dear Investors, however please remember not to disturb your risk appetite and asset allocation while investing. How you invest is as important as where you invest. So please avoid replicating your friends or peers portfolio's, it may not suite your risk appetite.







his knowledge of Osteopathy. Along with his wife Rati, who would create the oils and ointments prescribed by him, Dr. Amaria set up the Jal-Rati Charitable Trust which till date gives free medication to needy patients irrespective of race, creed or colour.

Jal began working with a printing press but his love for healing and social service led him to study medicine. He spread his services across Mumbai and even had a centre in Dahanu. These centres will always be known for their serpentine queues of patients eager to see the excellent doctor.

For 35 years Dr. Amaria served the Indian Community. He was also very involved in the Zoroastrian Community affairs and was one of the main forces behind the shifting of the Soonawalla Dar-e-Meher from the Lal Baug Agiary to Mahim. He was a delegate at the Parsi Matrimonial Court in 1986 and also a proud member of the team that brought the fire from Aden to India (it now rests at the Lonavala Agiary).
